This film, produced and directed by S.B. Audubon member Gail Osherenko, documents the break in Plains All-American's pipeline in May 2015. That spill sent 140,000 gallons of crude oil onto the Gaviota coast and into the ocean, closing two state beaches, affecting 150 miles of coastline, and killing over 300 sea birds and marine mammals.

In addition to being an avid supporter of our chapter, Gail is an independent documentary film maker and long-time environmental activist. Her other films include "Dark Side of the Loon", "Arctic Expedition", and "Loon Chick's First Summer".
